Chairman Shelby, Chairwoman Lowey, Vice Chairman Leahy, and Ranking Member Granger,

As you consider appropriations for government programs in Fiscal Year 2020, we strongly urge you to continue significant funding for the deployment of broadband in rural America.

We are a diverse group of stakeholders representing a broad spectrum of rural interests. We believe the health and productivity of the people we represent throughout rural America are dependent on access to high-quality broadband. We support the House of Representatives' inclusion of \$605 million in their Agriculture Appropriations bill for the USDA Broadband ReConnect Program.

The ReConnect program is designed to offer loans and grants to finance broadband in the rural areas lacking sufficient broadband access. Earlier this year, the U.S. Department of Agriculture accepted applications for a first round of funding from the program. The total amount of money requested in the initial round of applications already far exceeds the funds currently available for the program. We believe that initial demand represents a mere fraction of the total investment needed going forward to close the digital divide.

USDA has signaled that much of the money previously allocated for the ReConnect program will be committed in the coming weeks to the first tranche of awardees. We are concerned that a lapse in appropriations in Fiscal Year 2020 will deny funds for those communities in need of broadband and interested in pursuing ReConnect funding. Continued direct federal investment is critical to closing the digital divide and enabling rural consumers to fully participate in our 21<sup>st</sup> Century economy and society.

As your deliberations continue, we encourage you to maintain these critical investments in rural America. Thank you for your consideration of this matter.
