Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Wednesday, June 8, 2022, the undersigned on behalf of NTCA–The Rural Broadband Association (“NTCA”)¹ spoke with the following Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) staff: Rashann Duvall, Assistant Chief of the Wireline Competition Bureau’s Telecommunications Access Policy Division and Jessica Campbell, the Team Lead for the Commission’s Affordable Connectivity Program (“ACP”). The discussion was consistent with previous advocacy on the issue. *See, e.g., Ex Parte* Letter from Brian Ford, Vice President – Federal Regulatory, NTCA, to Marlene H. Dortch, Secretary, Commission, WC Docket Nos. 21-450, 20-445 (fil. May 4, 2022). NTCA in particular reiterated its support for promoting program integrity through a usage requirement for ACP enrollees, but pointed once again to the substantial complexities and expense faced by small operators attempting to comply with the rule. The parties discussed the scope of a tailored approach for this group of companies that would promote program integrity but limit the burden on “small” operators.
