USTelecom – the Broadband Association ("USTelecom"), represented by the undersigned, NTCA – The Rural Broadband Association ("NTCA"), represented by Brian Ford, and the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association ("NRECA"), represented by Brian O'Hara (together, the "Associations") met via videoconference with Jessica Campbell and Allison Baker of the Wireline Competition Bureau on October 24, 2022. During the meeting, the Associations proposed the collection of data aggregated by zip code as an alternative to the more granular proposal in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. This compromise would allow providers to rely on information already in their billing systems to prepare their submissions, thereby reducing the burdens of data gathering, and balances the interests of all – providers' interest in ease of administration, consumers' interest in a simple enrollment process, and the Commission's interest in informative data about the Program.
