Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, August 6, 2015, Shirley Bloomfield, Chief Executive Officer of NTCA—The Rural Broadband Association ("NTCA"), together with the undersigned, met with Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel and her wireline legal advisor, Travis Litman, to discuss issues presented in the above-referenced proceedings. Specifically, we discussed the efforts of NTCA and its rural stakeholder allies to engage actively with the Federal Communications Commission (the "Commission") in updating existing cost recovery mechanisms to address consumer demand for broadband services. We outlined the substantial industry consensus achieved with respect to a two-track approach to universal service reform, consisting of: (1) a simple and straightforward set of changes to existing mechanisms to make them more efficient, effective, forward-looking, and updated for a broadband world; and (2) a voluntary model-based support path for those carriers seeking to take such support subject to reasonably defined but responsible build-out obligations. We also discussed possible alternatives to such reform tracks and the potential benefits and complications associated with each.
