Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Monday, October 24, 2016, the undersigned, on behalf of NTCA—The Rural Broadband Association ("NTCA"), spoke via telephone with Stephanie Weiner, legal advisor to Chairman Tom Wheeler, regarding matters in the above-referenced proceeding.

Specifically, consistent with prior advocacy, NTCA emphasized the need for prompt action immediately after November 1, 2016 with respect to the sorting of model elections and resolution of any budget concerns that may arise should such elections result in "oversubscription" for the model. *See Ex Parte* Letter from Michael R. Romano, Senior Vice President, NTCA, to Marlene H. Dortch, Secretary, Federal Communications Commission (the "Commission"), WC Docket No. 10-90 (filed July 28, 2016); Petition for Reconsideration and/or Clarification of NTCA, WC Docket No. 10-90, *et al.* (filed May 25, 2016) ("NTCA Petition"), at 12-14. NTCA also observed that failure to achieve quick and carefully calibrated resolution of any budget concerns that arise out of model oversubscription could have a significant punitive impact on non-model mechanisms – and, most importantly, upon the consumer rates for standalone broadband that are already highly likely to be negatively affected by insufficient support budgets – contrary to the stated goals of reform. *See* NTCA Petition, at 2-9; *see also Ex Parte* Letter from Michael R. Romano, Senior Vice President, NTCA, to Marlene H. Dortch, Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, WC Docket No. 10-90 (filed May 12, 2016) (identifying several options for addressing budget implications of model elections).
